The Carle is pleased to present *Tall Tales and Short Tales: The Art of Uri Shulevitz*, a retrospective of the acknowledged master in celebration of his 80th year. Organized by Curator Emeritus, Nick Clark, the exhibition will comprise approximately 90 works surveying Shulevitz's career as a picture-




book artist and will include a selection of his independent art. Shulevitz garnered the Caldecott medal for his *Fool of the World and the Flying Ship* in 1969 and won Caldecott honors in 1979, 1999, and 2009—most recently for his *How I Learned Geography*, a poignant memoir of the trials of his youth and how a map fueled his curiosity and imagination. Working in a wide variety of media, the artist demonstrates remarkable versatility as he interprets an equally wide range of literature. An illustrated catalogue with an essay by Clark accompanies the exhibition.
